Stockholm, July 12.

THE Queen of Sweden gave a magnificent Entertainment on Wednesday last to the Prince Royal, upon Occasion of his Name-Day. The Garden of Dronningholm was finely illuminated, and the Royal Family supped under a Tent, in which were placed five Tables of eight Covers each; and the whole was not ended till Two o'Clock the next Morning.

Yesterday Count Wiede Sparre was made President of the College of War. The same Day Count Zinzendorf, the Saxon Minister, arrived here from Dresden.

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

IT having been represented to His Majesty, that several Persons, who have obtained Orders of His Majesty in Council for Grants of Land in His Majesty's Island of St. John in North America, have neglected to take out such Orders, or, if taken out, to present them to His Majesty's Governor of Nova Scotia, by Means whereof His Majesty's Gracious Intentions, with Respect to the Settlement of that Island, may be defeated, and the Cultivation and Improvement thereof greatly obstructed and retarded; It is therefore this Day ordered by His Majesty in Council, that the Governor, or Commander in Chief for the Time being, of His Majesty's Colony of Nova Scotia, do forbear to pass any Grants, under the Seal of that Colony, of any Lots or Parcels of Land in His Majesty's said Island of St. John, unless His Majesty's Order in Council, directing the same, shall have been produced to him on or before the first Day of May, which shall be in the Year 1769: And that this His Majesty's Order in Council be published in the London Gazette, to the End that all Persons concerned may have due Notice thereof.

THE Elector of Palatine's Minister at this Court has received Orders from his most Serene Electoral Highness, to acquaint the Merchants concerned in the Quicksilver-Trade, that one Mofengeil, Master of the Quicksilver Mines in that Electorate, having had the Assurance, from his own Accord, to sell that Commodity

in Holland and England for four Years to come, free of all Charges to Amsterdam, at 73 Kreuzers per lb. has of late absconded. As the Quicksilver from that Electorate, at future Sales, might, by that Means, fall in Price; and as the said Mofengeil was never authorised to do so; this is to caution the Traders not to make any Advances to the said Mofengeil upon such Contracts.

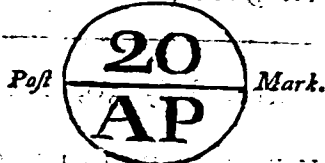
