An A.9 to discontinue, in such Manner and for such Time as are therein mentioned, the landing and discharging, lading or shipping, of Goods, Wares, and Merchandife, at the Town, and within the Harbour, of Bofton, in the Province of Maffachuset's Bay, in North America.

HEREAS dangerous Commotions and Infurrections have been fomented and raifed in the Town of Boston, in the Province of Mallachufet's Bay, in New England, by divers ill-affected Persons, to the Subversion of His Majetty's Government, and to the utter Deftruction of the publick Peace, and good Order of the faid Town; in which Commotions and Infurrections certain valuable Cargoes of Teas, being the Property of the East India Company, and on B. a d certain Vessels lying within the Bay or Harbour of Bolton, were feized and destroyed : And whereas, in the prefent Condition of the faid Town and Harbour, the Commerce of His Majefty's Sub-jects cannot be tafely carried on there, nor the Cuftoms payable to His Majefty duly collected; and it is therefore expedient that the Officers of His Majefty's Cuftoms should be forthwith removed from the faid Town: May it pleafe your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's mult Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this prefent Parliament affembled, and by the Authority of the fame, That from and after the First Day of June, One thousand seven hundred and seventy-four, it shall not be lawful for any Person or Persons whatfoever to lade or put, or caufe or procure to be laden or put, off or from any Quay, Wharf, or oth r Place, within the faid Fown of Botton, or in or upon a y Part of the Shore of the Bay, commonly called the Parbour of Bofton, between a c-rtain leadland or Point called Nahant Point, or the Eattern Side of the Entrance into the faid Bay, and a certain other Headland or Point called Alderton Point, en the Western.Side of the En trance into the faid Bay, or in or upon any Ifland, Creek, Landing-Piace, Bank, or other Place, within the taid Bay or Headlands, into any Ship, Vessel, Lighter, Boat, or Bottom, any Goods, Wares, or Merchandife whatfoever, to be tranf-ported or carried into any other Country, Province, or Place whatfoever, or into any other Part of the faid Province of the Maffachuset's Bay, in New England; or to take up, difcharge, or lay on land, or caufe or procure to be taken up, discharged, or laid on land, within the faid Town, or in or upon any of the Places aforefaid, out of

HE following Act of Parliament, | any Boat, Lighter, Ship, Veffel, or Bottom, any paffed in the prefent Seffions, and Goods, Wares, or Merchandife whatfoever, to be brought from any other Country, Province, or Place, or any other Part of the faid Province of ! the Maffachufet's Bay in New England, upon Pain of the Forfeiture of the faid Goods, Wares, and Merchandife, and of the faid Boat, Lighter, Ship, Veffel, or other Bonom into which the fame fhall be put, or out of which the fame fhall be taken, and of the Guns, Ammunition, Tackle, Furniture, and Stores, in or belonging to the fame: And if any fuch Goods, Wares, or Mer-chandife, shall, within the faid Town, or in any the Places aforefaid, be laden or taken in from the Shore into any Barge, Hoy, Lighter, Wherr or Boat, to be carried on Board any Ship or Veffel outward-bound to any other Country or Province, or other Part of the faid Province of the Massachuset's Bay in New England, or be laden or taken into fuch Barge, Hoy, Lighter, Wherry, or Boat, from or out of any Ship or Veffel coming in and arriving from any other Country or Province, or other Part of the faid Province of the Maffachufet's Bay in New England, fuch Barge, Hoy, Lighter, Wherry, or Boat, fhall be forfeited and lott And be it further enacted by the Authority afore-

faid, That if any Wharfinger, or Keeper of any Wharf, Crane, or Quay, or their Servants, or any of them, shall take up or land, or knowingly fuffer to be taken up or landed, or shall ship off, or fuffer to be waterborne, at or from any of their faid Wharfs, Cranes, or Quays, any fuch Goods, Wares, or Merchandife; in every fuch Cafe, all and every fuch Wharfinger, and Keeper of fuch Wharf, Crane, or Quay, and every Perlon what-ever who shall be affisting, or otherwise concerned in the fhipping or in the loading or putting on Board any Boat, or other Veffel, for that Purpole, or in the upfhipping fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandife, or to whose Hands the fame shall knowingly come after the loading, fhipping, or unfhipping thereof, fhall forfeit and lofe Treble the Value thereof, to be compared at the higheft Price which fuch Sort of Goods, Wares, and Merchancife, shall bear at the Place where such Offerice shall be committed, at the Time when the fame shall be fo committed; together with the Vessels and Boats, and all the Horles, Cattle, and Carriages, whatio-ever made use of in the fhipping, unhipping, landing, removing, Carriage, or Conveyance of any of the aforefaid Goods, Wares, and Merchandile.

And be it further enacted by the Authority faid, . That if any Ship or Veffel fhall be moored. lie at Anchor, or be feen hovering within the faid Bay, defcribed and bounded as aforefaid, or within One League from the faid Bay fo described; or the faid Headlands, or any of the Islands lying bei yea or within the tame, it shall and may be lawfal for any Admiral, Chief Commander, or Commissioned Officer, of His Majefty's Fleet or Ships of War, job.
